BRHLL Tournament Seeding Tiebreaker

- I. Teams shall be seeded in the tournament bracket for the specified number of teams provided by Little League International based on the final regular-season standings.
- II. A team's seed shall correspond to its regular-season finish based on winning percentage. (i.e., the champion shall be the No. 1 seed, the runner-up the No. 2 seed, etc.).
- III. In case of a tie for any place finish in the regular-season standings, the following tie-breaking procedure shall be followed in order to seed teams in the tournament bracket:
 - a. Two-team tie:
 - i. Results of head-to-head competition during the regular-season based on win-loss record.
 - ii. Each team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regularseason standings (or in the case of a tie for the championship, the next highest position in the regular-season standings), continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - 1. When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
 - 2. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against the team or group are unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1, but 2-0 is not better than 1-0).
 - iii. Coin toss conducted by the President or designee.
 - b. Multiple team tie:
 - i. Results of head-to-head competition during the regular-season.
 - 1. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against the team or group are unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1); in the case of tied percentages vs. the team or group of 1.000 or .000 the following shall apply: 2-0 is better than 1-0; 0-1 is better than 0-2..
 - 2. After the top team among the tied teams is determined, the second team is ranked by its record among the original tied teams, not the head-to-head record vs. the remaining team(s).
 - ii. If the remaining teams are still tied, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the final regular-season standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
 - 2. When comparing records against a single team or group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against the team or group are unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1, but 2-0 is not better than 1-0).
 - iii. Coin toss conducted by President or designee.
